

### **April 2021 MESSAGE**

Infections and death from COVID-19 are coming down significantly, and optimism is spreading. And of course, the vaccine is little by little, reaching the people, which again makes people dare to lead a somewhat more normal life. While there were obvious problems in the way the pandemic was handled in this country, vaccines became available early and in great numbers. A general information campaign that included internet as well as TV, radio and the printed press could and should have been organized.

I was lucky to have a friend who had an idea of what to do. What also happened was that there were people who had contacts who could get you an appointment. Members of Nor-Bu experienced that through Joe and Grethe Zarnitz, who through their contact got more than 200 people vaccinated! It should not have been their job to do what they did, but let us be glad that we have caring people like Joe and Grethe. You are true heroes. And so is my friend who got me on the track to vaccination, our District Secretary, Jeanne Addison.

With vaccinations ramping up, it is my hope that we will get back to having regular meetings at the Cabin again. Our March corned beef and cabbage dinner was certainly a great start to what hopefully will soon become a more normal life.
